



Mentor Guidelines and Responsibilities

A mentor/co-mentor is one who commits herself to lead a small group of ladies through a 36-week discipleship journey. This experience of leading others and watching them grow in their relationship with God is an absolute miracle. God is a transforming God, and when we run to Him and take others with us, our lives and their lives are never the same.

Mentor Guidelines -

- Attend mentor training before WOV season begins
- Meet bi-weekly with facilitator for mentor meeting and prayer times
- Attend weekly WOV meeting
- Daily quiet times & focused prayer for WOV and ladies in the program
- Connect weekly with your group members
- Participate along with group members in weekly assignments
- Complete assignments for mentors as directed by WOV Leader
- Accountability to WOV Leader with any concerns
- Exercise confidentiality of group members with the expectation of the need to share with the WOV Leader
- Be a student of the word, a servant leader, and a prayer warrior
- Attend required end of season WOV commissioning service

Mentor Accountability Requirements -

- Daily commitment to develop ongoing relationship with God - Bible reading, journaling and prayer time
- Scripture memorization
- Follow a prescribed Bible reading plan
- Weekly homework lessons
- Faithful and consistent church attendance
- Attend corporate prayer meeting monthly (i.e. Wednesday Prayer Service)
- Serve my church or community a minimum of one time per month (i.e. Chapelhill Ministries, Pantry, CarePlace, PRC, etc.)

What to expect during the season -

At weekly gatherings, the WOV Leader will provide the necessary print materials and handouts required. Most weekly lessons will include a large group activity, small group activity, homework, and reminders for memory verses and Bible reading. The mentor/co-mentor role will be in guiding the discussion during the small group activities, as well as praying with the ladies and providing accountability for them as they complete the 9-month program. The goal for the small group discussion time is to gain an understanding of God's word, prayer, and application strategies of the curriculum.
